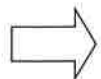

High School Planning Guide:

Please review the “High School Planning Guide” as you plan for your future courses. The guide includes detailed information about graduation requirements, course descriptions and prerequisites, NCAA eligibility requirements, dual credit information, and much more. Access the guide on the district website. Go to www.rps205.com, click Resources for Students, then click High School Planning Guide.

Review of Graduation Requirements (page 20 of High School Planning Guide):

- **English:** 4 years (8 credits)
- **Math:** 3 years (6 credits)
- **Science:** 3 years (6 credits) including Biology, and Integrated Science I & II or Chemistry & Physics
- **Social Studies:** 3 years (6 credits) Global Studies, US History, Government/Economics
- **PE and Health:** (7 credits PE and 1 credit health) **unless eligible for PE exemption
- **Fine Arts, Foreign Language, CTE:** 2 years (4 credits)
- **Additional Electives:** (10 credits)
- **TOTAL 48**

You *must* have 12 credits to be a Sophomore

If you have 11 or fewer credits, you will *still* be classified as a 9th grader.

If you have failed a course that is a graduation requirement you may make up the failed course through night school or summer school. See your counselor if you are interested in night school or summer school registration. Cost is \$170 per course. Forms should be available in December. Registration deadline will be early January.

Pathway Elective: This is an elective that you will take within your academy. You must take a minimum of **ONE** pathway elective each year. For each year of high school, you will take an elective class within your Academy Pathway. This sequence of courses is designed to help make you more prepared for a specific career area.

Elective: Any other elective you choose based on personal interest or preparation for beyond high school. Your global electives may be within your chosen Academy, but they can be outside too.

PE/Health/ and exemptions

A semester of Health is required for graduation. This is typically paired with a semester PE option.

If exempting PE for an eligible reason, Health will be paired with a semester elective. Students wanting to exempt PE to take a full year elective will also be deferring Health to junior or senior year. When exempting PE, the PE credit is no longer required, however students still need to reach 48 total credits to graduate.

PE exemption form is **REQUIRED** if wanting to exempt PE.

Drivers Education will be offered to students through PE (one quarter is Driver's Ed, one quarter is Team Sports). You must also pass at least 8 classes in the 2 semesters prior to enrolling in driver's education, according to state law. The course has a \$250 fee. **If you do not write Drivers Ed in as your PE option, you may not get the option to choose it at all for next school year.**

Advanced Placement (AP)

- Advanced Placement courses are college-level courses. The pacing, difficulty, skill development, and content of the AP curriculum are designed to help students prepare for success in college.
- AP courses will require more intensive work and preparation than honors courses. Some require summer assignments. Students should expect to struggle at times and should plan to seek new ways to learn and study.
- Students enrolling in AP courses are required to take the AP exam in May. There is a fee for each AP exam (currently \$94 each). Students eligible for a fee waiver are eligible for a reduced price for the exams. Qualifying scores can earn students college credit.
- Each student receiving a passing grade in an AP class will be given an extra quality point for those classes for determination of GPA and class rank. (Weighted grades)
- AP classes available to sophomores are AP Psychology, AP World History, and AP Human Geography. (AP Biology for students who completed Chemistry in freshman year.)
- Students signing up for AP courses should consider other time commitments (work, activities, etc.) as students will not be able to drop AP courses because of the amount of work and time required. Please plan to balance all commitments.

Minimum Coursework Recommended for College Admission

4 years English
3 years math including college prep math
3 years science
3 years social studies
2 years of the same foreign language (or art, music, theater, or CTE courses in some cases)
Rigorous full course schedule with honors and AP options recommended

Newspaper/Yearbook: Sign up if you are interested. Please select a back-up choice in case the number of students who sign up exceeds the positions available. Students should enjoy writing.

Sports Eligibility

Students must pass 5 classes the previous semester to participate in a sport. For example, to participate in a Spring sport this school year, you must pass 5 courses fall semester.
