Gym teacher was outside with a class and a bee stung her upper left leg. She radioed to the office that she needed an EpiPen related to her known allergy to bees. She said her asthma would flare up if the EpiPen was not given right away. EpiPen 0.3mg was administered to the left thigh lot number 8FM371 expiration 2/20. The teacher remained in the office for 30 minutes monitored by pulse oximeter. Her O2 sat remained 98 and heart rate was stable @ 89. The teacher refused having 911 called even though →

the RN told her it was district policy. She returned to the playground with an icepack and planned to sit along the side to watch her class.
